Saint Rose of Lima Academy

Saint Rose of Lima Academy is a pre-Kindergarten through Grade 8 Catholic Elementary and Middle School under the Archdiocese of Newark Schools Office.

The curriculum stresses academic achievement within a Christian community where the child feels that he/she is loved and respected by his/her peers as well as the teacher. Vatican II texts are used so that our theology is in compliance with the bishops of the world. United with each other in meaningful liturgy and prayer, the students can further come to an understanding of the Christian life. At Saint Rose of Lima Academy, we are attempting to "teach as Jesus did."

The Diocesan curriculum maps and guidelines, consistent with the State of N.J. guidelines, are followed for the teaching of all secular subject areas. The curriculum is marked by current content and fresh approaches to methodology. There is emphasis on principles rather than fact, on learning through problem solving rather than by precept. We strive to offer a program which makes use of many sources of reading material, a wide variety of audio-visual and technology tools and a multi-text approach to the content areas.

Philosophy

The purpose of the Academy is to provide an academic environment where moral values, service to others, and a positive self-image are developed, successfully preparing students to face the challenges they will confront throughout their lives. Students are educated spiritually and intellectually, integrating Catholic truths with personal values and morals. As educators, we recognize that each student is given a variety of unique gifts and abilities from God. Through an age-appropriate curriculum, the Academy strives to nurture these special gifts, and foster self-esteem, independence, and respect for others. We firmly believe that within a Catholic community setting each student will:

- be recognized with the dignity worthy of one created by God and for God, regardless of age, background or achievement
- be given the opportunity to develop, according to talents and needs, as a unique human person
- experience an integrated system of Catholic truths and personal values
- be challenged to use their special gifts in the service of others

Philosophy of the Extended Care Program

St. Rose of Lima Academy Extended Care Program provides a safe welcoming environment for the students of St. Rose of Lima Academy to

pray, learn, play, and foster relationships outside of the comprehensive classroom. In turn, parents will be assured in knowing that their child is in a safe and caring environment as they complete their work and ministry before picking up their child.

Admission Information

Nondiscriminatory Policy

St. Rose of Lima Academy admits students of any race, color, and national or ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students of the school. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national or ethnic origin in the administration of its educational policies, admissions policies, or athletic and other school-administered programs.

Requirements include the following which are on file in the School Office:

- *Health Records
- *Immunization Records
- *Birth Certificate (original)
- *Record of IEP / FSP/504

Extended Care Requirements:

- *Completed Application
- *Emergency Form
- *Medical Release Form

All new students will be given a trial period of not less than one trimester. If during this trial period there are any problems, a student may be asked to withdraw his/her attendance at St. Rose of Lima Academy Extended Care Program. The recommendation and decision of the Director in collaboration with the principal is final.

Allergy Policy

St. Rose of Lima Academy is a nut free school.

St. Rose of Lima Academy Extended Care Program recognizes that an allergy is an important condition affecting many school children and positively welcomes all pupils with allergies to participation in the program.

All Extended Care staff who come into contact with children with allergies are provided with training on allergies from the school nurse who has had specialized training. Training is updated annually and as needed.

1. Asthma/Allergy Medication

Immediate access to reliever inhalers/Epipens® is vital. Children are encouraged to carry their reliever rescue medication pursuant to a medical action plan furnished by their health care provider. Parents are asked to ensure that the school is provided with a current labeled rescue medication.

2. Record Keeping

At the beginning of each school year, or when a child joins St. Rose of Lima Academy, parents are asked to submit a child's medical record. From this information the school keeps its asthma/allergy register which is available for all school and Extended Care staff. If medication changes in between times, parents are required to inform the school and the Extended Care Director.

3. The School Environment

The school does all that it can to ensure the school environment is favorable to children with asthma or allergies. As far as possible the school does not use chemicals in the Extended Care Program that are potential triggers for children with asthma/allergies. Be advised that no school or Extended Day Program can guarantee that a child will not come in contact with a substance that may trigger an attack.

Allergic Reaction/Emergency

In the event of a suspected allergic reaction (where there is no known allergic history), the emergency medical services will be called immediately.

A parent or guardian of a student with diagnosed food allergies is responsible for providing all food for his/her own child. Snacks will be kept in a separate snack box or chest provided by the parent or guardian.

Tables will be washed with soap and water following any food related events held in the Extended Care Room.

Proper hand cleaning techniques will be taught and encouraged before and after the handling/consumption of food.

Custodial Information

It is the responsibility of the parents to share any official custodial information determined through the courts. Official custodial agreements will be kept in a confidential file in the office of the principal. It is extremely important that this same information is shared with the Director of the Extended Care Program so that the student(s) is released to the custodial parent or guardian.

Bullying and Cyberbullying

St. Rose of Lima Academy attempts to provide a safe environment for all individuals. Verbal or written threats made against the physical or emotional well-being of any individual are taken very seriously. Students making such threats (seriously or in jest or online) face detention, suspension, and/or expulsion.

Cell Phones, I-Pads and other Electronic Devices

Students participating in the Extended Care Program should at no time be making calls, texting, taking photographs, playing games, listening to music, or watching videos on their electronic devices. This includes, but is not limited to: cell phones, I-Pads®, E-readers, etc. Items taken away from students will be returned to the parent(s)/guardian(s) on the <u>last day</u> of the school year.

Child Abuse Laws

St. Rose of Lima Academy abides by the Child Abuse laws of the State of N.J. This law mandates that all cases of **suspected** abuse and/or neglect be reported to Child Protective Services.

Conduct

In accordance with the stated philosophy of the school, which emphasizes deep respect for the human dignity and uniqueness of every individual, each student will be considerate of the rights of others in all interactions. All students are expected to cooperate with the spirit and policies of the school which are designed to foster mature development and personal responsibility. This requires courtesy in all personal relationships, promptness in fulfilling obligations, concern for the environment, and many other factors which the students' sense of appropriateness will indicate to them.

The Extended Care Director in collaboration with the Principal reserves the right to determine the appropriateness of an action if any doubt arises.

Items such as, but not limited to, questionable books and pictures, White-out®, Sharpie® markers, knives, guns, matches, cigarettes, ecigarettes, toys, trading cards, laser lights, CDs, I-Pads, fidget spinners, or cameras are not allowed at school at any time.

The school administration, in accordance with state laws, will determine the appropriate disciplinary measures to be taken concerning the presence of these items in the school. Items taken away from students will be returned to the parent(s)/guardian(s) on the <u>last day</u> of the school year.

Crisis Plan

St. Rose of Lima Academy has implemented a "crisis plan" in the event of a lockdown emergency. All teachers and Extended Care Staff are aware of the procedure to follow to keep your children safe.

Emergency Drills

During fire drills, students should follow these regulations:

1. Rise in silence when the alarm sounds;

- 2. Close windows and doors;
- 3. Walk to the assigned place briskly, in single file at all times, and in silence;
- 4. Stand in a column of two's, facing away from the building;
- 5. Return to building when signal is given.

Gum

Students should not chew gum at school at any time that they are at school this includes during the Extended Care Program. Disciplinary action will occur for students who are chewing gum.

Harassment

Harassment of any type is not tolerated. The Principal investigates all complaints of harassment. Students involved in harassing behavior face detention, suspension, and/or expulsion.

Hours of Operation

The Extended Care Program is open from 2:45 PM -5:55 PM any day that the school is open. The Extended Care Program is closed on Snow Days, Teacher Workdays, Scheduled Holidays and other days when the school is not open. Please refer to the website for any exceptions to this schedule.

All students should be picked up by 5:55 PM each day. Students who are not picked up by 5:55 PM will incur an additional charge of \$5.00 per minute

<u>Schedule</u>

The Extended Care Program schedule includes the following:

Monday through Friday:

2:45 PM – 3:20 PM – Restroom Break, Snack and Drink Time (Provided by the student)

Monday through Thursday:

3:20 PM – 4:00 PM – Homework/Study Hall: Students are divided by grades. All students will be involved in study, reading, or review

Students in Grades 5-8 may utilize a longer time for study if needed.

Friday: 3:20 PM – 4:00 PM: Organized Craft, Board Games

Monday through Friday:

4:00 PM – 5:50 PM: Free Play Outside (Inside depending on weather daylight.)

**A movie is an optional choice on the 12:10 dismissal of each month.

Medication

No medication is given during the Extended Care Program. Students who need medication between 2:45 PM and 5:55 PM should make arrangements with the nurse prior to coming to Extended Care.

Office Records

Since the Extended Care Program utilizes the school data base, Parents/Guardians are requested to notify the School Office in writing of any change of address, custody, home telephone numbers, cell phone numbers, business phone numbers, e-mail addresses and/or phone numbers of emergency contacts. This will guarantee that office records are accurate, complete, and up-to-date.

<u>Uniforms</u>

Students in the Extended Care Program will wear their school uniform to Aftercare. If the student can change into play clothes on their own, they are allowed to change to play clothes.
